Manna and Mercy: A Curriculum for Elementary Children

Based on Manna and Mercy: A Brief History of God's Unfolding Promise to Mend the Entire Universe by Daniel Erlander

AGE APPROPRIATENESS: These lessons are ideal for grades 1st through 6th with the understanding that adaptations may be necessary. Some adaptations are suggested in each lesson.

They are also excellent supplemental activities for youth groups who are reading Erlander's Mercy and Manna. Some activities could be used in family or adult groups to support the reading of the resource book as well.

NUMBER OF LESSONS: There are 51 lessons, one for each Sunday other than Christmas and Easter and 1 fun quiz lesson to use after a long break between M & M lessons. The quiz lesson can be easily adapted, depending on where you took your break. Some lessons can be used as standalone lessons, but most require you to follow the chronology of events in the Bible.

MATERIALS: Materials such as game components, floor maps, props for drama, plush animals, or finger puppets are not provided and need to either purchased elsewhere or created. Photographs of materials are available upon request at no charge. Permission has been granted from Daniel Erlander to use any images in the resource book.

MANNA AND MERCY PRAIRIE DOGS:

Two prairie dog characters are in Erlander's <u>Mercy and Manna</u> making humorous commentary. This curriculum uses prairie dog plush animals or finger puppets as characters who show up in lessons now and then to ask questions about the humans in the stories and offer an opportunity for review. The prairie dogs, named Manna and Mercy, do not speak; instead they "whisper" in the ears of the leaders because they are shy and humans are their predators. These prairie dogs are reminders that God's family and the future includes all of creation.

TAKE-AWAY COMPONENT: Erlander's <u>Mercy and Manna</u> is the key resource and basis for this curriculum. Ideally, parents can own the book and read it with their children as lessons progress. Each lesson has an optional take-away component for parents that references the pages of the Erlander book.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE: Children will develop an overall view of the Bible (its stories & many crucial concepts) in a loving, creative atmosphere that encourages learning and celebrates God's creative love of diversity and God's constant love for all the world.

REMINDER SAYING: (optional) God loves us (hand on heart)

by providing manna (arms out)

and mending us with mercy (hug self)

no matter what we do (head back and forth).

CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENT:

Most lessons begin with a Bible story that can be told to a small or large group. Activities should happen with small groups in a classroom that allows for the movement of furniture (tables and chairs) as needed. Sometimes all furniture will be moved to the edges to allow for floor maps. At the end of most lessons, all move to the worship area which can be a simple altar.

OVERALL THEMES:

God is active in human history and in all creation.

God loves us by providing (manna) and mending (mercy) unconditionally.

God's kind of love can be seen throughout the Bible and all creation. Jesus teaches about God's kind of love through his life and stories. Because of Jesus' words, certain aspects of the Bible come more clearly into focus such as justice, peace, humility, and inclusion

OVERALL SCRIPTURE BASIS: Ephesians 1: 9-10

(NRSV) With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

(Erlander's paraphrase): God has made known to us the mystery of God's will, according to God's pleasure set forth in Christ, as promised for the fullness of time, to unite everything in Christ, everything in heaven, and everything on earth.

(A simpler version for children):

The Bible tells the story of God and creation, especially our human nature.

The Bible tells what God gives and wants for creation.

The Bible tells how God loves us and provides for us no matter what we do.

This is manna and mercy.

The Bible tells us how Jesus came to teach us and show us God and what God wants for us.

What does God want for us?

For all creation to be united in Christ and living in shalom, peace and wholeness.

Hints for the Manna and Mercy Elementary Curriculum:

- Directions for the stories and lessons are wordy to give the storyteller context and options. Do not read them or try to memorize them. There is more content than must be covered. It is more important to enjoy telling the story and engage with the children. Key concepts and phrases are underlined or highlighted as reminders of their importance.
- Some stories will take longer than others. The time for lessons will need to be adjusted.
- Be careful to allow for altar time. This is where application is emphasized.

Lesson Activity: Manna and Mercy Museum

- Teaching these lessons to non-readers will be tricky. You may need to emphasize only a few of the concepts and change the format of teaching. Use your discretion. Adaptations are suggested.
- Combined-group storytelling is recommended, but all teachers should be present to hear the story and reinforce it during the lesson. Using non-teachers for storytelling is a good way to involve many adults in your church. Storytellers should be skilled at storytelling.
- Storytellers and Teachers will need access to the primary resource (Erlander's book).

- Encourage parents to have access to the resource book and tell them the themes and pages covered so that they can read the book and look at the illustrations with their children. The revised version has Take-Away documents for parents that do this.
- At least one adult helper in addition to the teacher is assumed for each group. No more than 10 children per group is best, especially for young children. Some lessons need more adult helpers such as the carnival lessons.
- The supply list is usually what is needed for 1 group/classroom only.
- Look for supplies at dollar stores, thrift stores, websites such as amazon.com, eBay, etc.
- Documents/materials sometimes show up at later lessons so save them. Use props for decorating rooms once they are introduced. The last lesson is a Manna and Mercy Museum Tour where many props are displayed.
- Illustrations from the resource book may be used throughout the curriculum. I have Daniel Erlander's permission for this. Use them how you see fit. Coloring them as they are explained is a good option for the younger children.
- The prairie dog plush animals or finger puppets may be added to lessons for younger children at any time deemed appropriate. Don't over use them. They need to be "special guests." Putting little scarves or hats on them allows you to tell them apart. The same flexible use is true for the M & M glasses.
- I encourage you to adapt lessons to your church's culture, history, geography, or news events. The goal is to make the lessons meaningful to the children and church community.
- Use the quiz lesson at any time; adapt according to the content you've covered.
